Course Objectives / 授業の目的と 概要	(COURSE OVERVIEW) Phenomenology is a method in philosophy, founded by Edmund Husserl (1859-1938). Husserl himself intended to contribute to the epistemology of science but the phenomenology as a method has a wider potentiality which goes beyond his intention.  In short, the phenomenology is a powerful tool to analyze the experience and the behavior of human beings. Otherwise than other empirical methods of research (for example, qualitative researches in sociology), it can grasp the meanings of the individual experience in its contingency.  In my research in this domain of the applied phenomenology, I conducted my fieldworks first in a pediatric hospital to study the autism of children (more precisely, PDD) and actually I collaborate with nurses to analyze their praxis.  In this course, I would like to introduce basic ideas and technics of applied phenomenology.
