Course Objectives / 授業の目的と 概要	The era of globalization has led to an increased awareness of cultural diversity within a growing number of countries. In this course, we will explore key issues regarding the effect of such cultural diversity on societies. Students will learn about concepts such as multiculturalism, assimilation, citizenship, etc. Using these concepts critically, we will cover several country cases and discuss problems, challenges, and responses in relation to cultural diversity. In particular, we will look at the US as a historical case of a multicultural society, European countries and the backlash against multiculturalism, and East Asia with a particular focus on Japan.

By the end of this course you should be able to: demonstrate an understanding of the key issues and challenges of culturally diverse societies; work critically with key concepts used to study cultural diversity; broaden your understanding of the historical context that affects our attitude towards different cultures; develop a better understanding of the contemporary nation-state and its politics towards varieties of culturally diverse groups and the ability to critically analyze and identity arbitrary judgements and prejudices. 2.
