Learning Methods		
Course Objectives	Students shall learn relationship between modern Japanese social structure and the modern Japanese ideology, which determines the life of ordinary democratic minded people. This lecture is, in other words, designed for those who wish to learn how Japanese people accommodate other members of society and present social structures. Ideology has tended to be thought as a political matter. However, from a social psychological point of view, we need to think about what determines our everyday lives.	
Learning Goals	1	Through detailed examinations of Japanese history, culture, religion, language, media and up-to-date social issues, students will formulate ideas on how 'ideology' (such as Emperorship) has worked to support modern 'democracy' (such as Symbol Emperor System and Pacifism).
	2	Those who wish to discuss 'democracy', 'conservatism', 'egalitarianism', 'liberalism', 'freedom', 'Constitutional monarchy' and modern Japanese history (mainly post-war period) are all welcome.
	3	At the end, students are able to demonstrate critical understanding about ideology, from the view points of Japan as well as students' own
