Special Note	Prior knowledge of Japanese language at advanced level is required to attend classes. A screening will be performed on students to assess students' pre-requisites and requirements. The classes will consist of a mix seminar, practical activities, audio-visual presentations, peer reviews and group discussions. Reading materials will be agreed with other instructors in order to provide students with learning basics to engage with original Japanese texts reading. The course is organised to provide maximum hands-on practice for students. Note: The syllabus is flexible and may be adjusted based on students' abilities. If students are interested in tackling more challenging texts than those initially provided and exhibit a positive attitude toward learning, changes to the syllabus are possible. This will be discussed in the first class. Students are welcome to suggest readings that align with their specific research interests, as long as they remain within the social sciences field.
